



2018 CRHA Challenge Terms and Conditions

1. STABLING

Stalls will be available starting at 1:00 pm Monday, October 22 based on availability, at a fee of \$250 per stall. The stalls at the Los Angeles Equestrian Center may be portable and will NOT include any pre-bedding. Haul-ins are allowed and a grounds fee of \$25 per day will be assessed in the Show Office.

2. FEED & BEDDING

Los Angeles Equestrian Center allows only the use of wood shavings in the stalls. US Horse Feed & Shavings is the exclusive horse bedding supplier for LAEC. Any and all horse feed and bedding sales must be coordinated with US Horse Feed & Shavings. Please contact 818-559-9699. No other shaving vendors may deliver to LAEC without permission from US Horse Feed & Shavings and/or LAEC. Shavings can be brought on to LAEC property individually, for the sole use by the exhibitor or trainer.

3. LIQUOR

It is unlawful for any person or organization to bring upon or have upon these premises, any alcoholic beverages other than the alcoholic beverages, which the licensed caterer of LAEC is authorized to sell.

2. JUDGES

All decisions of the judges are final.

3. PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

All exhibitors will be subject to the use of photographers and videographers under the direction of show management for the benefit of show promotion. No exhibitor will be allowed the discretionary use of his/her services. **ONLY THE OFFICIAL EVENT PHOTOGRAPHER WILL BE ALLOWED TO SELL PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE CHALLENGE HORSE SHOW.** All images pertaining to or in relation to the Challenge Horse Show are under the sole ownership of the CRHA. Only reporters assigned by recognized newspapers, radio and or television or the Associated Press will be issued press passes. Requests must be made in writing and mailed or faxed to CRHA. All other photographers agree not to sell or distribute their photographs/videos unless given express permission in writing by the CRHA. Photographers who have not followed these requirements may be escorted off the grounds.

4. DAMAGE

Individuals will be held responsible for any physical damage inflicted on the Los Angeles Equestrian Center or any entities on those premises. Moreover, show management will be reimbursed any costs incurred as a result of damages caused by an individual. All owners, exhibitors and vendors shall be responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, or employees to stalls, buildings, or any other properties or parts on the LAEC grounds and shall be billed accordingly.

5. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS AND CERTIFICATES

Health requirements for the State of California and the LAEC will be followed. A 30 day health certificate and a 6 month Coggins are required upon arrival for all horses attending the event from outside the state of California. Please include statement regarding Vesicular Stomatitis.

6. LIABILITY

By participating in the Challenge, all competitors agree to abide by the rules of the show and its governing body, NRHA. In addition, all persons involved acknowledge that horseback riding and all equine activities are inherently dangerous and that these activities will expose persons to above normal risks of bodily injury and death. By participating in this competition with this knowledge of the danger involved, the competitor, the parent or guardian of a minor, all his or her heirs, estate and assigns agree to accept any and all risks of injury and death.

7. RULES/CHANGES

CRHA, its Board of Directors and its management, reserve the right to make additions or changes to this event at any time. CRHA and show management has the authority to enforce all rules referring to the show and may excuse any horse or exhibitor prior to, during, or after the judging without refunds. CRHA and show management reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations. All decisions are final. By way of making an entry, the exhibitor is assuming responsibility for knowledge of the rules and releases CRHA and show management from any claims or losses. CRHA and show management reserve the right to modify or change conditions for the Challenge event at any time.

8. RIGHT TO CANCEL

CRHA and show management reserve the right to cancel the event without notice at any time prior to the contest and without liability to the show management or CRHA. In the event of such cancellation, entry fees and other show fees paid in advance shall be refunded. CRHA and show management reserve the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by CRHA and show management, their decision is final.

CRHA AND SHOW MANAGEMENT RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE, ACCEPT CONDITIONALLY, OR TO CANCEL ANY ENTRIES, DISQUALIFY AND RIDERS OR EXHIBITORS, PROHIBIT EXHIBITION OF ENTRIES AND CANCEL AWARD PRIZES, WITHOUT CLAIM OF DAMAGES. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the show management, but the show management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, CRHA, Officials, Employees, Directors, Sponsors and LAEC blameless for any loss or accident to horse(s), employees or equipment.

9. SECURITY AND PARKING

Trucks, cars and trailers must park in designated areas only.

10. ANIMAL CONTROL

Dogs are to remain on a leash and must be kept under control at all times. It is the responsibility of the owners to pick up after their dogs.

11. BEHAVIOR, CONDUCT AND ANIMAL WELFARE

Any action of disrespect, deceit, or fraud directed to CRHA, show management, grounds crew, show representatives or judges will result in disqualification from competition and removal from the facility. No entry or stall refunds will be provided. Individuals accused of unsportsmanlike conduct will be subject to the disciplinary procedures set forth by the National Reining Horse Association in Article A of the NRHA handbook. **NO ABUSE TO ANY ANIMAL WILL BE TOLERATED.** Stabling and arenas will be monitored. Anyone found to be abusing animals will be disqualified and reported to NRHA.

12. AN OPEN CHECK will be required to check in and receive your number at the show office.

Returned checks will be charged a \$50 service fee.

13. FUTURITY ENTRIES

Horses are to be shown one handed or may be shown two handed in a snaffle bit or hackamore. Horses may be shown one or two handed in any legal bridle and may not change or switch from one to two hands.

14. DERBY ENTRIES

Junior Horses 5 and under may show two handed in a snaffle bit or hackamore.
